Meeting of Members July 20, 2017

The Regional Jail Authority meeting was called to order at the Community Corrections Center, 147 Fort Collier Road, Winchester, Virginia 22603 at 10:00 a.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Sheriff Taylor called the meeting to order at 10:06 a.m.

Mr. Whitley introduced Mr. Tierney, Interim County Administrator, to the Jail Authority.

II. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Sheriff Taylor solicited a motion to approve the Agenda. A motion was made by Mr. Ash to approve the agenda. Sheriff Mosier seconded the motion. The Authority unanimously approved.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM THE APRIL 2017 MEETING

Sheriff Taylor solicited a motion to approve the minutes from the April 20, 2017 meeting. A motion was made by Ms. Wyatt to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Meinheimer. The Authority unanimously approved.

IV. EMPLOYEE OF THE QUARTER

The Jail's Spring 2017 Employee of the Quarter, Officer Ryan Strother, was unable to attend the meeting.

Due to the resignation of the County Administrator, Ms. Brenda Garton, who also served as the Chair of the Jail Authority for 2017, a special election was held. Ms. McCann-Slaughter nominated Mr. Tierney as Chair. Since there were no other nominations, the nominations were closed. The Jail Authority unanimously approved the nomination.

A motion was made by Sheriff Mosier to allow the Vice Chairman, Sheriff Taylor, to run today's meeting. Ms. Heritage seconded the motion. The Authority unanimously approved.

V. PERSONNEL UPDATE

Mr. Whitley provided the following personnel chart as of 07/16/17:

Mr. Whitley explained the biggest reason for the number of vacancies that we currently have are due to retirements and it has been more difficult to find individuals who are qualified. The Superintendent has spoken to other Jails in the state and they are having the same hiring difficulties.

VI. <u>OPERATIONAL UPDATE – DOC RESPONSE</u>

Mr. Whitley distributed a letter from DOC dated 06/07/17, responding to the Jail Authority's letter written to them on 05/22/17, regarding the removal of state responsible inmates from the Regional Jail. The Superintendent reported that there are approximately 30,000 inmates incarcerated in the Department of Corrections and the number of inmates incarcerated in local jails, which is state responsible, has risen as high as 5,000. That number has dropped to 3,600. The Superintendent is hesitant about sending another letter to DOC with the reimbursement of the security system still pending.

Mr. Hefty reported that the request for reimbursement of 50% of the new security system has been approved by DOC but has not been funded. The General Assembly still needs to approve the request.

Mr. Hefty explained that DOC is supposed to remove inmates from local jails if they are sentenced to 1 year or more, which are considered state responsible, within 60 days. The General Assembly overrides that with a budget appropriation act item that says DOC will decide when they want to take the inmates and local jails have no recourse. He suggested that the jail prioritize inmates that should be transferred with medical issues to get them transferred out first.

Mr. Tierney pointed out that the facility is in a much better shape than it was a few years ago, but said that the Jail Authority definitely needs to keep an eye on this issue to ensure these numbers are reduced.

Ms. Freeman said that it's very important that we get the unfunded mandate down.

Mr. Whitley reported that the weekender population is down, which is a good thing. The Superintendent reported that drunk in public incarcerations have increased, but DUI arrests are down.

The Superintendent reported that DUI arrests are down affecting the ASAP case load. ASAP'S case load last year was 1985. This year the case load has dropped to 1789, which is 196 less.

Mr. Whitley reported the FY17 ADP for Work Release Program was 38. Home Electronic Monitoring was 12 and Community Inmate Workforce was 42.

The Superintendent reported the performance measures for Pretrial Services.
